4) Committee Updates

a) Beautification

- i) General update
 - (1) Cleanups: Have had 4 cleanup events in the few months. Volunteers meet the last Sunday of the month (Labor Day weekend excluded: we have leaf bags and gloves available for self-run events- email Beautification. Chair@FellsProspectCommunity.org) 10a-12p.
 - (2) September 28th is the next planned event. We are seeking recommendations for blocks that need cleanup.
 - (3) Tree Baltimore: Tree Keepers certification workshop series begins Sept 3rd visit TreeBaltimore.org to sign up for the free classes.
 - (4) Charm City Cleanup- DOT, DPW and other agencies were in Upper Fells fulfilling 311 requests
- ii) Love Your Block Grant update
 - (1) Garden workshop is awaiting response on approval. Review committee is about a week behind schedule.

- ii) Pedestrian Safety around Patterson Park

Ryan and Jamie attended meeting in early August. Looked at every intersection, pedestrian access issues, traffic control.

- iii) There is discussion with City Council to install a gate on Luzerne St. entrance to PPk.
- iv) Police have requested training to be better prepared to ticket various infractions causing issues for park-goers. BPD is looking to create a permanent route. Currently, the police presence is overtime work. Routes tend to be early mornings and evenings when park attendance peaks.
- v) Safety walk in October 15th (tentative date): Walk around the neighborhood, looking to identify vulnerable areas, lighting deficiencies

5) Community Input

a) Jack installed café lights and determined it was a reasonably approachable project for handy residents who have trees for stringing lights.



- b) The City has a single preferred vendor (American Water Resources) to cover water/sewer lines ruptures or backflow from the sewer. Residents have been receiving mailers and there has been some concern expressed about legitimacy. Homeowners insurance may/may not cover the costs; check with your insurance carrier if you need to purchase a special rider.
- Member noticed a sign on the old Burger King lot indicating intended use as a parking lot.
 - i) FPCA sent a letter of support for the zoning variance. That variance was pushed back because a previous property infraction was still be resolved. A new zoning variance hearing will be set and posted upon resolution.
 - ii) Skateboard Karl is in Starthouse rehab center. Prosecutor has indicated he is facing 3 years of deferred incarceration, if he fails to complete rehab. He has been living in on 400 block of S PPk Ave. The judge who is overseeing his supervision has left a positive impression on the resident.
